What can 9th graders be doing to prepare the road to college?

Academics are the most important part of your college application. Colleges want to see more than just good grades; they also want to see that you have pushed yourself and taken the most challenging courses offered at your school. Set yourself up so that you can take full advantage of whatever AP and upper-level courses Creekside offers.

Graduation Requirements – Class of 2016 Students entering high school in 2011-2012

2.0 or higher unweighted GPA, Passing score on 10^{th} grade Reading FCAT 2.0, passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC, Geometry EOC and Biology EOC is required to earn credit, and the results will count as 30% of the final course grade

Common Myths


- Do I need Community Service hours?
 - Not for graduation, only for Florida Bright Futures
- How many years of Foreign Language do I need?
 - None for graduation, only for acceptance into a college or university and for Florida Bright Futures
- Are all courses calculated into my GPA?
 - Your GPA starts in 9th grade (or in 8th grade if you took a course for high school credit in middle school)
 - All courses are included into GPA
 - Grades become part of your GPA when credit is issued.
- Do I only have one GPA?
 - Not really! You have an unweighted and a weighted GPA. Bright futures calculates your GPA differently from schools, and colleges often recalculate on their own system.

Academic support at the school level

- Tutoring by subject area available after school; see Guidance website under "Announcements"
- Morning or after school extra help from teachers
- One-on-one peer tutoring done by Honor Society students
- Ramp Up Sessions

Florida Bright Futures

www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org

- Merit based scholarship program funded by the Florida Lottery.
- The purpose is to reward academic achievement by providing funding to attend postsecondary education in Florida.
- There are three different awards within this program



General Eligibility Requirements

- Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen as determined by you postsecondary institution.
- Enroll in an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary institution
- Enroll in a minimum of 6 hours per term (or the equivalent)
- Begin using the scholarship funds within two years of graduation (unless you enlist in the military).
- Must not be found guilty of, or plead no contest to, a felony charge.
- Must apply during your last year in high school Application opens Dec. 1 of senior year.
- Students must also complete the FAFSA application after January 1st of their senior year

General Academic Requirements

- Application opens December 1st of senior year
- 16 Core Academic credits
- Core GPA includes (does not round):
 - 4 English credits
 - 4 Math credits (algebra 1 or higher, LAM and Informal Geometry do not count)
 - 3 Natural Science credits
 - 3 Social Studies credits
 - 2 Foreign Language credits
 - 2 additional academic courses to help raise GPA
- GPA can be tracked on FLVC.org starting the end of 1st semester in 9th grade year
