Grade Forgiveness



• Students may earn grade forgiveness for classes where they earned a D or F by taking a virtual school class.

APEX – a computer program used to retake a class where you earned failing grades.
 Classes are taken here at Creekside during the school day.

 You can take a class for grade forgiveness online over the summer but be aware it may take longer than you think!



Dual Enrollment Policy and Requirements



- 1. <u>Students</u> are required to communicate any issues to the appropriate people (high school contact, dual enrollment office, faculty, parents, etc.).
- 2. Dual enrollment students are <u>held to the same standards</u> as other college students.
- 3. Students must abide by all SJR State policies and procedures including but not limited to the Student Handbook, attendance policies, academic integrity, and discipline policies as published.
- 4. Students are accountable for knowing the policies and outcomes related to grades, academic history, and graduation.



Dual Enrollment Criteria



- Meet the county criteria to take an honors/AP/DE level course
- 3.0 or higher **UNWEIGHTED GPA**
- Qualifying test score on either the ACT, SAT or PERT exam.

Summer 2019 Dual Enrollment at SJRSC



- Must meet all qualifying criteria by April 10th (Must take either Feb ACT, March SAT or PERT prior to April 10th)
- Must have an official test score from SAT, ACT, or PERT and a completed online application.
- Summer 2019 Course catalog to go live on SJRSC website in February (tentative date set by the college)
- All forms due no later then April 10th!!
- Students can take up to 8 credit hours over the summer



Fall 2019 Dual Enrollment at SJRSC



- Must meet all qualifying criteria by May 24th.
- Must have an official test score from SAT, ACT, or PERT and a completed online DE application.
- All forms due no later than May 24th
- Dual Enrollment students can take up to 10 credit hours per semester


• Seniors Only

- Rising Seniors can go part-time or full time at the college per semester.
- To go full-time (early admissions), student must have at least a 3.0 or higher UNWEIGHTED GPA and meet all other qualifying criteria (Test scores, etc.)




