

Many Scholarship committees are looking for students who have the ability to communicate effectively in writing. Essays are an excellent way for scholarships judges to choose the most qualified candidates.

Tips for writing the essay include:

- Giving yourself time- it takes time to construct a quality essay
- Following directions- word count and font size may be eligibility requirements
- Focusing on the topic- answer the question that is being asked
- Proofreading and editing your work- be clear/concise and correct any errors
- · Getting feedback- ask family members or others to read your essay and provide feedback

The Bright Futures Student Handbook is divided into short chapters to explain information about Bright Futures.

- 1. Sign up in Guidance
- 2. Write your name on the sign-up form for the visit you want to attend.
- Remove a label and place it in your planner to use as your pass for the day of the visit. Make sure to check in with your teacher first.

Day of Visit Procedure:

- 1. Check in with your teacher first! Show them the NEON pass in your planner.
- 2. After checking in, proceed to the location written on your pass. Bring your planner with you.
- 3. Attendance: Sign your initials next to your name on the sign-up sheet.
- You must report to the next class when the bell rings. If you are staying to talk to the admissions representative past the bell, you must have them write a pass in your planner.
