2017-2018 Student Parking Rules and Regulations

The following guidelines exist to help ensure the safest and most efficient use of our limited parking facilities. Please return this form signed by the student and a parent/guardian. This is not an all-inclusive list; the school administration reserves the right to revoke a student's parking pass for disciplinary reasons. Parking privileges are reviewed at the end of each nine weeks' grading period. Student parking rules, regulations, and criteria will be reviewed/revised throughout each semester to evaluate space, safety, need etc. Students are expected to follow all guidelines within the St. Johns County Student Conduct Code for maintaining a safe and orderly environment in the parking areas.

1. Driving to school is a privilege, not a right (Buses are available for all students residing within the Creekside High School attendance zone). To be eligible to purchase a parking permit, students must settle any outstanding fines from the previous school year. Students must also return this form with the proper signatures.
2. Parking is reserved for seniors first and juniors second. No sophomores or freshmen are permitted to drive to school. This includes excuses such as: I am home schooled, I have a band trip, I play varsity football, my mom said its ok, etc.
3. Parking permits for rising seniors will be available to purchase for the 2017/2018 school year from Monday, April 17th through Friday, April 28th. Rising seniors who think they may be in the top 100 should also make an effort to get their parking permits during this time. Permits will be handed out at Orientation. Rising juniors may purchase permits from Monday, May 1st through Friday, May 12th. Permits will be handed out at Orientation.
4. All parking permits cost \$75. There will be no refunds. Replacement permits cost \$10.
5. At the time of purchase all drivers must provide the following: A **copy** of the student's valid driver's license, a **copy** of the current registration, a **copy** of proof of insurance, and the signed 2017-2018 Student Parking Rules and Regulations form.
6. If, in an emergency, you must drive a different vehicle than registered, please put your hanging permit in the new vehicle and notify someone in the Dean's office or the parking attendant of the change.
7. The parking permit will have a number on it that identifies the student driver. It should be hanging from your rear view mirror with the number facing out at all times. There are no exceptions.
8. Student parking is located in the lot south of the main entrance. Students who have been issued a parking permit may park in any available spot within this lot. Students may only park in this area. There will be no parking on the street adjacent to the school or in any other undesignated area.
9. Any vehicle that does not have a current CHS parking permit or is parked in any undesignated area is subject to receiving a \$10 ticket or being immobilized (a parking boot will be placed on the tire). If your vehicle is immobilized, the cost to have the boot removed is \$25 and will result in the loss of your driving privileges for two weeks. CHS is not responsible for inconveniences resulting from the time necessary to obtain payment for fines or for removal of the boot.
10. No temporary parking passes will be issued.
11. Students identified illegally obtaining or distributing parking permits will forfeit their right to park on the campus for the remainder of the school year. You may not let anyone else use your parking permit for any reason.
12. All vehicles are subject to search. Possession of drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, pocket knives or weapons of any kind will result in an out of school suspension and loss of driving privileges.
13. The parking area is off limits to all students during the day. You must get a pass from one of the Deans if you need to access your vehicle. If you are in the parking lot without a pass for any reason (getting books, getting your lunch, bringing something out to your car, etc.), you could lose your parking permit.
14. Students are responsible for their vehicle and its contents.
