TEAM'S TIMELINE & MILESTONES

YEAR

- 2008-09 Creekside's inaugural wrestling season with Coach Rick Marabell named as the school's 1st head wrestling coach. In the first season the young Knights were 4-8 in dual matches & placing 7th at 1a district
Joe Ritchey 119, Daniel Williams 135 and Parker Dufresne all become 1st district place winners & Regional qualifiers
- 2009-10 Team's season dual match record 23-3. Matt Watson becomes the school's 1st Conference Champion & the first to win 40 matches in a season. Placed 4th as a team at 2a district led by CHS 1st district champion Mat Watson with 8 regional qualifiers. Mat Watson & Parker DuFresne both become the school's 1st state qualifiers
- 2010-11 Team's season dual match record 19-6. Season's highlight beating #10 Rank Harmony HS to win the Army Duals
Matt Watson 1st CHS wrestler to win the Westside Kiwanis. Luke Pustay becomes the 2nd Conference Championship.
Team runner up at 2a District with 9 individual regional qualifiers led by district champion Alex Watson.
Matt Watson first 2x state qualifier.
- 2011-12 Team's season dual match record 14-1 losing to Orange Park, but redeeming the lost later at home 53-27
Season's highlight beating #10 Rank Bolles School to win the Bartram Bear Duals. Aaron Galang, Gage Preston & Shane Carpenter each win Individual Conference Championships with the team placing runner up.
Shane Carpenter & Aaron Galang both win the Westside Kiwanis with Aaron being awarded outstanding wrestler with team placing 4th overall. Aaron Galang 1st CHS wrestler to win Clay Rotary. Team runner up at 2a district with 8 individual regional qualifiers losing by a narrow 9 point margin with district champions Aaron Galang, Gage Preston & Shane Carpenter. Aaron Galang & Shane Carpenter become the school's 1st regional champions along with Gage Preston placed 4th. The team placing 6th overall with 3 state qualifiers the most in school history.
- 2012-13 Teams dual record 16-2. Aaron Galang & Shane Carpenter winning Conference Championships. Shane Carpenter winning the Westside Kiwanis with team placing 2nd overall. Aaron Galang & Shane Carpenter both winning the Clay Rotary & both named outstanding wrestlers. Shane Carpenters CHS 1st wrestlers to win Flagler Rotary.
Aaron Galang & Shane Carpenter each win district Championships with team having 9 regional qualifiers.
Shane Carpenter repeats as regional champion along with Austin Wynn & Aaron Galang qualifying for state
Shane Carpenter becomes the CHS 1st wrestling state champion with an undefeated season of 41-0 & Aaron Galang placing 6th which gives our program our first state placers. The team placing 15th out of 80 teams in the state tournament. Aaron Galang becomes the first wrestler to reach 100 career wins.
- 2013-14 Team dual record 17-4. CHS wins the Bartram duals for the 3rd year in a row. Ryan Baker wins the Westside Kiwanis.
Wins first 2a team district championship with 7 champions (Austin Wynn, David Tyer, Jared Langdo, Jeremy Beaulieu, Gus Fischer, Rafi Lopez and Cole Eubanks) & total of 10 place winners. Top 5 finish in the Regional with a total of 5 state qualifiers, which include regional champion Austin Wynn along with placers Jared Langdo, Jeremy Beaulieu, Rafi Lopez and Cole Eubanks.
- 2014-15 Team dual record 27-3. CHS wins the Bartram duals for the 4th year straight. Austin Wynn wins the Westside Kiwanis.
2A district team runner ups with 7 individual champions (Austin Wynn, Ty Van Sickel, Brandon Dickman, Jared Langdo, Willy Lulias, Gus Fischer and Cole Eubanks) with a total 10 place winners. Top 5 finish in the Regional with a total of 5 state qualifiers, which include regional champion Austin Wynn along with placers Ty Van Sickel, Brandon Dickman, Jared Langdo & Cole Eubanks. Brandon Dickman becomes the first freshman to win district, place a regions & qualify for states along with Austin Wynn becomes the first 3x state qualifier.
Austin Wynn & Jared Langdo cap off their careers by both gaining 100 wins.
- 2015-16 Team dual record 15-9. District 2a team runner ups with 4 champions (Steven Stanton, Brandon Dickman, Gus Fischer & Robert Grower) with a total of 10 placers. Top 5 finish in the Regional with 3 state qualifiers, which include regional champion Gus Fischer & placers Brandon Dickman & Willy Lulias. Gus Fischer & Brandon Dickman both place 5th in their perspective weight classes.
Gus Fischer caps off his careers by gaining 100 career wins & become a 3x district champion
- 2016-17 Team dual record 16-6. Brandon Dickman wins the Clay Rotary & named Outstanding wrestler.
Win District 2a Team Championship with 6 champions (Luke Davis, Jacob Cooney, Brendan Jones, Brandon Dickman, Trey Chessser & Robert Grower) and a total of 12 placers. Top 5 finish in the Regional tournament with 3 state qualifiers, which include regional champion Brandon Dickman along with placers Brendan Jones & Robert Grower.
Brandon Dickman gains 100 career wins as a jr. becomes a 3x district champion, 3x state qualifier & 1st 2x state placer
- 2017-18 Team dual record 30-7. Inaugural State Dual Series District and Regional Champions along with Final Four appearance. Brandon Dickman wins Fagler Rotary tournament. District 4 Team runner up with 4 district champions (Billy Shaw, Brandon Dickman, Trey Chessser & Saul Storey)

& total 13 regional qualifiers. Top 4 finish at regional with 3 state qualifiers, which include regional champion Brandon Dickman & Saul Storey along with placer Billy Shaw. Brandon Dickman reaches 200 career wins, 4x district champ, 2x regional champ, 4x state qualifier & 3x state placer

2018-19 Team dual record 21-5 which marks the programs 200 career dual match win. Teams placed runner up at the district duals and the IBT with 2 district champion (Cody Smith & Trey Chessser) & record 13 regional qualifiers.

Cody Smith becomes the 3rd freshman to win district & Trey Chessser becomes the 3rd 3x district champion.

Top 5 team finish at region with 2 regional champion (Trey Chessser & Saul Storey) & 1 place winner Jalen Hines 4th.

Saul Storey becomes the 3rd 2x regional champion & 6th 2x state qualifier.

2019-20 Team dual record 9-10. Teams placed 3rd at the district the IBT with 1 district champion Jalen Hines & record 10 regional qualifiers. Jalen Hines placed 3rd a regionals and becomes a 2x state qualifier

BELIEVERS AND ACHIEVERS

- 2008-10 Nathan Haney 1st year record was 14-15 as a Junior. His senior year record was 26-13 & regional qualifier
- 2008-10 Logan Haney 1st year record was 8-4 as a Junior. His senior year record was 26-10 & regional qualifier
- 2008-10 Parker Dufresne in his Senior year at Regional lost by technical fall & move to the consolation. Battling back only to meet the same wrestler in the state qualifying round. Parker won 11-10 to become one of our 1st state qualifiers.
- 2008-11 Luke Pustay 1st year record was 15-12 as a Sophomore and wrestling at 3 different weights 112, 119 & 125. Senior year he was 34-4, won a Conference Championship @ 112, place 2nd at District & career record of 75-18
- 2008-11 Matt Watson 1st year record was 11-12 as a Sophomore. Junior year record was 41-4 record & became the school's 1st conference & district champion as well as the 1st 2x State qualifier with 80 career wins & 191 takedown
- 2008-11 Justin Langdo spent his 1st two years in a back-up roll and finally got his starting spot his Senior year. His record was 20-16 and qualifying for regional.
- 2010-11 Aaron Soto decided his Senior to come out for the wrestling team having never wrestled before. His record was 16-14 and went on to be a regional qualifier.
- 2009-11 Alex Watson started his wrestling career in his Junior year & went on to have 24-8 record. His senior year, he went on to become the school's 2nd District Champion. ended his career with an overall 41-14 record.
- 2008-11 Daniel Williams, in one of his last matches for Creekside was against the 1A #2 rank wrestler in the State. Daniel went into the match injured, pretty much only had the use of 1 arm. He was behind 15-1 & if he gave up 1 more point the match was over, a technical fall. Never quitting, Daniel won the match by pin.
- 2008-12 Dylan Scanlon became the first 4 year starter for Creekside wrestling. As a freshman, he did not win a match, but through hard work and continuing to improve, Dylan has earned 70 career wins and became
- 2010-12 Brendan McLaughlin came out for wrestling his Junior year and his season record was 18-17. After that season, he dedicated himself in the off season & in his Senior year his record was 24-14. He was 1 match away from becoming a state qualifier, but could not continue due to an injury. A credit to Brendan mental toughness, he never lost an overtime match his season, which he had 3 his senior year.
- 2011-13 Austin Wynn a converted baseball player came out his freshman year & wrestled mostly JV. In his sophomore year, he accumulated a record of 30-11, placing 3rd at district & defeating our district champion to qualify for state and becoming the 1st sophomore to qualify for the state tournament.
- 2009-13 Aaron Galang started wrestling his freshman year & would become the most accomplished Creekside wrestler. He ended his career with an overall 114-22 record, 75 career pins and 250 career takedowns. He was a 2x district conference champion, 1x regional champion, 2x state qualifier and 1x state placer (6th).
- 2011-13 Shane Carpenter transferred from Gateway High School in PA with a 16-16 record. His over all record at CHS is 76-4 with 51 career pins & 90 career takedowns. He was a 2x conference, district and regional champion along with being the school's first wrestling state champion and having undefeated season of 41-0.
- 2013-14 Jared Langdo missing most of the season with a broken hand came back a week before the district to win the tournament than a week later placing in regionals to qualify for state.
- 2013-14 Cole Eubanks came of nowhere his junior year & surprised some of the top heavyweight wrestlers. This year he placed in every tournament except the state tournament, which he qualified.
- 2011-15 Austin Wynn a converted baseball player came out his freshman year and during his 4 years he has accomplished a great deal with a career record of 112-30. He currently holds the most takedowns in a season (158) & the career takedown record (317). He is a 2x district & regional champion as well as a 3x state qualifier
- 2012-16 Gus Fischer came out his freshman year and during his 4 years he has accomplished a great deal with a career 103-29. He holds the most pins in a season (33). He's a 3x district champion, 1x regional champion and 1x state placer with at 5th place finish to cap of his career.
- 2016-17 Brendan Jones came out of obscurity his junior year to place in every in season tournaments, winning district, placing at regionals and becoming a state qualifier. Brendan for the past two season wrestled on the JV, but putting the extra effort in the off season & transformed into outstanding wrestler and leaders. This season he was 35-19
- 2017-18 Max Patterson struggle with a shoulder injury for the past 3 years. In his Senior year at the regional tournament, Max battled back with 1 last second win and 2 over time matches to get tp the blood round or 1 match away from qualifying for state. Max wrestled pretty much with 1 arm and came up short to his goal of being a state qualifier, but in the end he left it all on the mat.
- 2018-19 Cody Smith a freshman and first year wrestler with a record of 25-10 did something that only 2 other freshman have done in the past 11 years, which is win districts. He continued his success at regional by battling back after a lost

all the way to the bloodround or the placement round. This is something that rarely happens with a freshman and first year wrestler.

2019-20 Jalen Hines started the season off wrestling 170 and mid season moved up to 182. His first time at that weight was at the Flagler Rotary Tournament. Jalen went on a tear and made it to the finals placing 2nd. The following week Jalen did the same thing in the Clay Rotary tournament. Then went on to be the solo district champion, regional place winner and state qualifer.
