## **Policy and Requirements**



- 1. <u>Students</u> are required to communicate any issues to the appropriate people (high school contact, dual enrollment office, faculty, parents, etc.).
- Dual enrollment students are <u>held to the same standards</u> as other college students.

- All forms due no later then April 10<sup>th</sup>!!
- Students can take up to 8 credit hours over the summer

- Must have an official test score from SAT, ACT, or PERT and a completed online DE application.
- All forms due no later than May 24<sup>th</sup>
- Dual Enrollment students can take up to 10 credit hours per semester


