Scholarship Scoring:

Essays:

Each essay will be worth 25% of the final score. The highest score a person can achieve on one essay is 25 points.

Booster Club Membership:

Membership in the booster club will be 10 points or 10% towards the final score.

Grade Point Average:

GPA will be up to 20 points or 20% of the final grade.

Sports/Honors/Awards

Each sport played will equal 2 points per year played. For example, a student playing football and track for all 4 years would receive 16 points.

Any sports honors or awards achieved will also be awarded 1 point. The most points any player can get in this category is 20 for 20% of the total score.
