### Information on Early Dismissal & Excused Absences:

Students Leaving Campus Early: A note is needed in order for a student to leave campus early. This note must be turned in to the Front Office no later than 9:15 am in order to receive a pass to get out of class. Prior to leaving, a student must report back to the front office to sign out.

#### Student Illness Protocol:

Your student needs to go to the nurse's office and allow them to follow procedure for checking out when sick. If you are going to be absent for any of the scheduled midterm days, you will need to still take the exams. For teacher-created midterms you must coordinate with your teacher when make-ups are. District-created midterms cannot be taken early! You will either make-up the midterm Tuesday, December 21st after the 7th period exam or when we return from winter break.

District created midterms make ups will begin on January 6th at 9:20a.m. If your student missed a district created midterm, please have them report to the auditorium that morning to take these exams. Make ups will be held from January 6th until January 12th.
