

Non-College Reportable ACT

On Wednesday, October 16th your student will take the Non-College Reportable ACT.

Students who participate in this ACT experience will be granted accommodations (i.e., extended time) in hopes that the extra time will give the student a better chance to acquire the necessary ACT English and Reading subtest score of 18 (average of the two subtests) to meet the FSA Grade 10 ELA graduation requirement and / or ACT Math subtest score of 16 to meet the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement.

However, because these accommodations are not officially approved by ACT, results earned during a non-college reportable ACT administration cannot be used for admissions or scholarship purposes.

Test Day Details:

When: Wednesday, October 16th | All testing begins at 9:20 a.m.

***There will be no late admittance to the testing rooms.
Students who arrive late and are scheduled to test will be sent to class.***

Students received a pass from their English or Reading teacher with their testing locations and the sections of the ACT they will need to complete for the concordant score(s).

Students will be dismissed to lunch following testing, but snacks are encouraged during breaks.

Students must provide their snacks/water bottles and personal test materials, including pencils and calculators if testing in math on Tuesday (*see calculator policy below*).

The following types of calculators are prohibited:

- Calculators with built-in or downloaded computer algebra system functionality, including:

Texas Instruments:

- All model numbers that begin with TI-89 or TI-92
- TI-Nspire CAS

Note: The TI-Nspire (non-CAS) is permitted.

Hewlett-Packard:

- HP Prime
- HP 48GII
- All model numbers that begin with HP 40G, HP 49G, or HP 50G

Casio:

- fx-CP400 (ClassPad 400)
- ClassPad 300 or ClassPad 330
- Algebra fx 2.0
- All model numbers that begin with CFX-9970G

- Handheld, tablet, or laptop computers (including PDAs)
- Electronic writing pads or pen-input devices
Note: The Sharp EL 9600 is permitted.
- Calculators built into cell phones or any other electronic communication devices
- Calculators with QWERTY format letter keys
 - This does not apply to calculators that are provided in a secure test delivery platform.
 - Letter keys not in QWERTY format **are** permitted.
