- Meet the county criteria to take an honors/AP/DE level course
- 3.0 or higher **UNWEIGHTED GPA**
- Qualifying test score on either the ACT, SAT or PERT exam.

- PERT testing is administered at St. Johns River State College during the school day.
- This exam is **not** administered at Creekside.
- Students schedule the day/time of their PERT test.
- Students must take all sections of the PERT exam.
- There is a test fee for the PERT exam.


