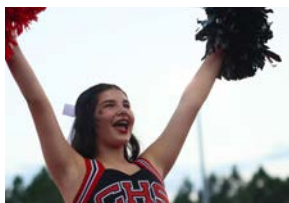
PARENT DROP OFF LINE: HELPFUL TIPS

Become an EMT through Dual Enrollment at St. Johns River State College

Be ready for employment at local fire rescue stations, ambulance services and local hospitals!



Contact your high school Dual Enrollment counselor today!

The program runs January - April 2027. Apply August 1 - October 15, 2026.

Classes take place at the St. Johns River State College Orange Park Campus, 283 College Drive, Orange Park, FL 32065.

Classes/labs held Tuesdays/Thursdays 6:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. and Saturdays 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Clinical and ambulance ride times will vary on evenings and weekends.

Students must be 18 or older before the end of the program and maintain an overall 2.0 unweighted GPA during the program (See Dual Enrollment for initial eligibility GPA).

Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to apply for the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) examination. Students will be required to obtain a background check, drug screen, physical exam and immunization record.

 - If need course reinstatement or help working with a teacher, SJVS admin can assist
 - Teachers help students complete so courses are added on time to graduate/promote
 - Placed in course with teacher in same day as request pending school counselor approval
- SJVS Registrar places courses on student schedule and transcript for zoned school

- Teachers located anywhere in the state of FL
- SJVS unable to place students in FLVS courses, length of wait time up to FLVS Registrar
- SJVS has no control over issues with FLVS teachers. Call FLVS helpline
- Zoned school registrar builds FLVS courses, taking longer to add courses to student schedule and transcript

What's the Same? St. Johns Virtual is a franchise of Florida Virtual, meaning we use the exact same platform and coursework as FLVS. The rigor, acceptability for college admissions, and policies for academic integrity are identical. Both schools allow students to take courses year-round

COMMUNITY ACTION TEAM

The Community Action Team (CAT) program offers parents and caregivers of youth ages 11-21 with significant mental health issues a safe and effective alternative to out-of-home placement.

Upon successful completion, the family should have the skills and natural support system needed to maintain improvements made during services.

MOBILE RESPONSE TEAM

The Mobile Response Team (MRT) provides assessments for youth in crisis, significantly reducing involuntary youth hospitalizations (Baker Acts) in St. Johns County.

Each year, the team diverts over 80% of youth in crisis from costly hospitalization.

MRT is available 24/7 in St. Johns County, by calling 9-1-1 or 9-8-8.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is the leading cause of death in student athletes and in the school system, most of which can be prevented. **Electrocardiogram (ECG or EKG) heart screenings are now required prior to participation in Florida high school athletics** and Who We Play For (WWPF) is honored to screen children across the state and country.

Together, we are advancing the standard of care. The result will be a generation that gets to grow up.



How it Works

- 1 Select a screening through our website: <https://www.whoweplayfor.org/heart-screening-registration>
- 2 WWPF and school district provide ECGs to students on site.
- 3 ECGs are interpreted by pediatric cardiologists volunteering with WWPF.
- 4 Results are delivered to the students' guardians and are connected with appropriate follow-up care.

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL POLICIES FOR ATHLETES, BAND AND CLUB SPORTS

- Before and after school, athletes need to park in the student parking lot not in the faculty parking, bus parking, or in front of the stadium. For morning workouts, the gate closest to the bus loop and the stadium will remain open from 6:00 am – 8:45 am. All athletes must park in student parking unless it's a Saturday practice.
- Athletes here for training or morning workouts before the school day, please remain with your coach until 8:45 am. If you are here after school, remain with your coach until you are picked up.
- Modified and non-traditional athletes arriving to campus before dismissal, MUST park in the student parking lot (not in front of the stadium, bus parking or in faculty parking.) Student parking lot gates to access the practice fields will be open at 4:05 pm M, T, Th, F & 3:05pm on Wednesdays. (Athletes are NOT to jump the fence to access the practice fields (they may enter the practice fields by the gym if the parking lot gates are locked. Athletes MUST walk along the sidewalks and not in bus or teacher traffic exiting the school.
- Parents and all visiting teams may not access the back of the campus until all busses have departed and dismissal is completed which is at 4:25pm (M, Th, Th, F and 3:25 pm on Wednesdays.)
